



A landmark year for gender balance in Slovenia

Finally, the year has come when Slovenia can boast as many as five full-length feature films from the hands of female directors and screenwriters. In 2018, when the Slovenian Film Centre prepared the first study of the state of gender balance in Slovenian cinematography, we discovered that as much as 90 percent of all films in Slovenian history had been signed by male directors and that the first Slovenian feature by a female director came out as late as 2002. A few years later, with the help of awareness-raising campaigns and promotion of the importance of gender balance in film storytelling, we ensured that in 2024, as many as five finished films out of twelve were made by female directors. Three of these films are debuts of young directresses, one of which received the Grand Prix at the Clermont Ferrand Festival in 2020, while another one won the 2022 European Film Award for Best Short Film. One of the films is the director's second feature, while the fifth one is

made by an experienced female director whose films have already been screened at A-category festivals and who completed her third feature this year. These excellent female filmmakers are joined by their male colleagues, two of them with their first films. Six full-length documentaries were also completed, half of which were directed by women, while the other half came from the hands of renowned male directors. The fact that as many as eleven short films out of twenty-two that were shot this year were directed by female directors also guarantees a sustainable future of gender balance in Slovenian filmmaking.

We are proud to present to festival selectors, sales agents, and distributors a selection of films which, for the first time in the history of Slovenian cinema, were created by a balanced mix of female and male directors.

At that time the convent is in the process of renovation by a group of Italian workers. An outgoing thirdgrader Ana-Marija notices Lucija's interest in the attractive dark-eyed worker and they decide to play a trick on him. After an unfortunate first orgasm, deep feelings of shame overwhelm Lucija, and the struggle with guilt about her impulses begins.

FAMILY THERAPY

Family Therapy revolves around a Slovenian 'nouveau riche' family living in a glass house, exuding detached superiority. This satirical setting provides the backdrop for a humorous reinterpretation of Pasolini's "Teorema": a young stranger disrupts the family dynamics, unveiling hidden chaos and dysfunctional relationships. The film not only questions the obliviousness to others' struggles but also probes the reasons behind their choices. Are they afraid of confronting their own vulnerabilities, or is it a learned indifference, a symptom of a broader societal ailment?

The film will have its world premiere at the Tribeca Film Festival in the International Narrative Competition in 2024.

HIDDEN PEOPLE

Guti (35, Slovenian) and Sig (50, Icelander) wake up naked and handcuffed to one another on a riverbank near Liubliana. Sig suffers from memory loss, while Guti recalls a fight with skinheads Sid drunkenly participated in and Guti tried peacefully to intervene in. Sig has no passport or any clue about his identity-the skinheads have taken everything he owned. Guti is trying to build a new home for himself on a river raft after losing his house to the bank and his life to his ex-wife. He introduces Sig to his friends-suburban misfits, who remind Sig of a legend of the hidden people. The film is a fairytale dramedy about new beginnings. It is also a self-ironic story about small countries and nations (Slovenia and Iceland) in the "big" Europe: about the unexpected connections that can help us find our place under the sun and continue with our lives. Finally, it is also about a vast number of invisible people who feel like "internal refugees" in the European societies they are a part of.

Luka Marčetić was born in 1985 in Zagreb. Croatia. where he lived until moving to Slovenia by the age of 15. He moved to California where he worked as a game developer with several startups at the age of 22. After moving back to Slovenia he graduated at the Institute and Academy of Multimedia in Ljubljana and started experimenting with different audiovisual formats for various platforms. He created the first Slovenian web series Day of Love in 2009, followed by three seasons of Paired Up, a television show which gained both critical and commercial success between 2015 and 2019. In 2016 he directed his first feature film, a local lowbudget comedy At Hostar which broke Slovenian box office records and became the most viewed film in Slovenian history.

Set in the picturesque coastal town of Piran, three children from distinct backgrounds cross paths. Mario, a local girl, lives with her grandmother. Robert, hailing from a modest family, is at summer camp while Barbara, from an affluent background, is on holiday with her father and his partner. She is also the unintended recipient of a misdirected SMS. This message sets off a domino effect, leading them through a series of puzzles and adventures tied to medieval Piran's mysteries. As they outwit caricatured bandits, Grandemare and Jofa, their friendship bond strengthens and love sparks between Barbara and Robert. The culmination of their journey reveals the "treasure": a collection of letters exchanged between famed violinist Tartini and the iconic violin maker, Stradivarius.

The film was presented at the 2023 festival in Tallinn as part of the Work in Progress – Just Films section.

THE SILENCE OF LIFE

An observational documentary with cinematic experience asking: What is important in life? The motivation for the film is director's loss of her father. Every one of us will have to face mortality. It's up to us what we'll be like in those moments. This is a story of retired journalist, paliative care promotor Manca Košir who gets diagnosed with cancer and lets us into her intimate world, which is the door in exploring departure. She says her friendship with death began at the age of 19, when she was in the film The Birch Tree (1967), lying in a coffin most of the time. It is also a story of director's experience of the loss of her father. But most of all it is a story about departing, memories and love. The creative documentary about mortality explores in its core the acceptance of time and celebration of life. What will you do with the time you have left?

Knowledge of history is the foundation of every nation! The film's content revolves around old beliefs in the Posočje region, the origins of which remain unknown. What is documented, however, is that in 1331, messengers of the new faith (Christianity) arrived from Čedad, initiating a violent Christianization process in Posočje. This lasted for a long time and was extremely brutal. Their sanctuaries were demolished, and adherents of the old beliefs were persecuted, many of whom were killed. As a result, they pledged to remain silent. This belief was passed down orally from generation to generation.
